Our trailer loading practice paid off as we had no problems loading the horses into the trailers. We were very proud of our volunteers and our horses! After returning to the ranch, we experienced tremendous heartbreak as we lost my horse, Romey. Romey was kicked by another horse and succumbed to his injuries. His loss has left a huge hole in my heart as well as everyone here at SIS. He was laid to rest here on the property next to my horse Ghost.

I want to thank everyone who brought flowers and beautiful gifts. I am forever thankful for everyone's kindness and love.


